OVERVIEW: *House Bill 911 would direct the North Carolina Department of Information Technology to study and assess the threat of foreign technologies in North Carolina State-owned computer systems.*

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 911 would direct the North Carolina Department of Information Technology (Department) to study and assess the threat of foreign technologies in North Carolina State-owned computer systems. As part of this study, the Department would identify and assess any threats from foreign technologies in North Carolina State owned computers where they exist and identify available remedies to address such threats, including any legislative changes. The Department would submit its report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Information Technology no later than March 1, 2020.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act is effective when it becomes law.
