OVERVIEW: *Senate Bill 232 requires State-administered programs that are targeted or directed at veterans, service members, or their families to annually report certain information to the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, and the Department to report the information received to the General Assembly.*

BILL ANALYSIS:

Senate Bill 232 would require an administrator of the twelve programs listed in the bill to determine the number of veterans, service members, and their families served and the services, benefits, and discounts provided to them and to track outcomes according to measures established by the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. The administrator of each program would be required to report the information collected during the previous fiscal year to the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs no later than September 1 of each year.

Beginning December 1, 2020, the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs would be required to annually report the information received from the programs to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective when it becomes law.
