OVERVIEW: *Senate Bill 474 abolishes obsolete boards and commissions that are no longer functional. The act is effective when it becomes law. The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) adds Sections 19.1 through 19.4 and makes technical changes.*

BILL ANALYSIS: The PCS for Senate Bill 474 abolishes all of the following and makes conforming changes:

- The Board of Directors of the Certification Entity for the Phase II Settlement Funds.
- The North Carolina Agency for Telecommunications.
- The Charlotte Douglas International Airport Commission.
- The Board of Directors of the Charlotte Regional Partnership.
- The Commission on School Technology.
- The Data Integration Steering Committee.
- The Eastern Carolina Regional Housing Authority Board of Commissioners.
- The Grants Management Oversight Committees.
- The Legislative Commission on Methamphetamine Abuse.
- The Motor Vehicle Dealers' Advisory Board.
- The North Carolina Community Development Council.
- The North Carolina Farmworkers Council.
- The Southern Growth Policies Board.
- The Southern Technology Council.
- The State Advisory Council on Employment Security.
- The State Suggestion Review Committee.
- The Statewide Portal Committee.
