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OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 579 would have the Program Evaluation Division study alternative organization and management structures for the Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice.

BACKGROUND: In 2013, the Department of Public Safety (DPS) combined the Department of Juvenile Justice and the Department of Adult Correction into a consolidated division, the Division of Adult Correction and Juvenile Justice (DACJJ).

BILL ANALYSIS:

Section 1 of Senate Bill 579 would have the Program Evaluation Division (PED) study alternative organization and management structures for the DACJJ.

PED would study the following four alternatives to the current DACJJ:

- 1. The Department of Correction- a new State department.
- 2. The Department of Juvenile Justice- a new State department.
- 3. The Division of Correction- an independent agency administratively located in DPS.
- 4. The Division of Juvenile Justice- an independent agency administratively located in DPS.

Section 2 of Senate Bill 579 would have the PED study the following aspects of each of the four proposed alternatives to the current DACJJ:

- 1. Organization including administration and personnel.
- 2. Budget including the cost of each new department or division and any required salary expenses.
- 3. Considerations such the advantages and disadvantages of each new department or division.
- 4. Implementation details such as a plan, proposed legislation, and a timeline.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act is effective when it becomes law.



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
