



# SENATE BILL 795: Laurinburg-Maxton Airport Commission.

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**OVERVIEW:** *Senate Bill 795 would rename the Laurinburg/Maxton Airport Commission, increase its membership, and clarify its powers and duties.*

## CURRENT LAW:

G.S. 63-4 authorizes the governing body of any city, town, or county to jointly acquire, establish, construct, own, control, lease, equip, improve, maintain, operate, and regulate airports or landing fields for the use of airplanes and other aircraft, and to use for such purpose any suitable property owned or controlled by such city, town, and county.

The Laurinburg/Maxton Airport Commission was created by ordinance of the City of Laurinburg for the purpose of operating the Laurinburg/Maxton Airport, and is authorized to exercise on behalf of the Town of Maxton and the City of Laurinburg all powers granted to each municipality by Chapter 63 of the General Statutes.

The Commission consists of six members serving terms of three years, three of whom are residents of the Town of Maxton appointed by that town's governing body, and three of whom are residents of the City of Laurinburg appointed by its city council.

**BILL ANALYSIS:** Senate Bill 795 would rename the Laurinburg/Maxton Airport Commission as the Southeast Regional Airport Authority.

The Authority would be empowered to purchase, acquire, establish, construct, own, control, lease, equip, improve, maintain, operate, and regulate airports and landing fields for the use of airplanes and other aircraft within the limits of Scotland County, and for this purpose to purchase, improve, own, hold, lease, or operate real or personal property.

The Authority would have seven voting members: three registered voters of the City of Laurinburg appointed by the city's mayor; one registered voter of the Town of Maxton appointed by the town's mayor; and three registered voters of Scotland County appointed by the chair of the county's board of commissioners. The Scotland County Economic Development Director would serve as an ex-officio nonvoting member of the Authority.

Voting members would serve two-year staggered terms beginning on January 1, except that two of the three City of Laurinburg appointees and one of the three Scotland County appointees would serve initial terms of one year. The old Commission members' terms would expire on December 31, 2020, and the new Authority members' terms would begin on January 1, 2021.

The bill would also repeal prior acts of the General Assembly pertaining to the Commission.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act would be effective when it becomes law.

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
