

SENATE BILL 812: Agricultural Sciences Center Funds.

OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 812 provides \$10.1 million in funding for the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services' new Agricultural Sciences Center using existing cash balances from four different sources.

BACKGROUND: The Agricultural Sciences Center will contain offices and labs that perform tests for four of the department's divisions: Food and Drug Protection, Standards, Structural Pest Control and Pesticides, and Veterinary. The building, scheduled to open in December of 2020 at a west Raleigh site, replaces four labs whose average age is more than 40 years.

BILL ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 812 provides \$115,000 in recurring funds for an Executive Director position for the Center, funded by a reallocation of funds from the Pay Plan Reserve. The bill also provides \$10 million in nonrecurring funds for equipment, moving costs, and other nonrecurring expenses drawn from the unencumbered cash balances of the following funds:

- ➤ \$3.8 million from the Shallow Draft Navigation Channel Dredging and Aquatic Weed Fund.
- ➤ \$1.2 million from the Agricultural Development and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund.
- ➤ \$5 million from the Expanded Gas Products Service to Agriculture Fund.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill becomes effective July 1, 2020
