SENATE BILL 95: Veterans Memorial Funds/Do Not Revert.

OVERVIEW: *Senate Bill 95 provides that funds appropriated for the construction of public facilities at the North Carolina Veterans Memorial Pavilion shall not revert to the General Fund until June 30, 2020.*

CURRENT LAW: S.L. 2017-57 ("Current Operations Appropriations Act of 2017") appropriated the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2017-2018 fiscal year to the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs for the construction of public facilities at the North Carolina Veterans Memorial Pavilion in Broadway, North Carolina.

Section 6.13(c) of S.L. 2017-57, which applies to the aforementioned funds, requires the return of funds to the State that have not been expended, made subject to an encumbrance, or disbursed to a subgrantee, by June 30, 2019.

BILL ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 95 extends the deadline in Section 6.13(c) of S.L. 2017-57 to June 30, 2020, for the funds appropriated to the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs for the construction of public facilities at the North Carolina Veterans Memorial Pavilion in Broadway, North Carolina.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Senate Bill 95 becomes effective June 30, 2019.
