HOUSE BILL 103: 2022 Appropriations Act, Sec. 16.6: Add Assistant District Attorneys to Various Counties

OVERVIEW: Section 16.6 of S.L. 2022-74 increases the number of full-time assistant district attorneys allowed in certain prosecutorial districts.

This section became effective July 1, 2022.

BILL ANALYSIS: Section 16.6 of S.L. 2022-74 increases the allowed number of full-time assistant district attorneys (ADAs) as follows:

- Prosecutorial District 3 (Pitt) moves from 14 to 15 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 8 (Edgecombe, Nash, and Wilson) moves from 21 to 22 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 10 (Wake) moves from 43 to 44 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 11 (Franklin, Granville, Person, Vance, and Warren) moves from 17 to 18 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 15 (Bladen, Brunswick, and Columbus) moves from 15 to 16 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 23 (Stokes and Surry) moves from 8 to 9 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 24 (Guilford) moves from 39 to 40 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 29 (Hoke and Moore) moves from 9 to 10 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 32 (Alexander and Iredell) moves from 14 to 15 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 38 (Gaston) moves from 18 to 19 ADAs.
- Prosecutorial District 43 (Cherokee, Clay, Graham, Haywood, Jackson, Macon, and Swain) moves from 14 to 15 ADAs.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective July 1, 2022.
