OVERVIEW: House Bill 12 is a local that would provide school calendar flexibility for Alamance-Burlington Schools and Guilford County Schools until the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year. The Proposed Committee Substitute added Guilford County Schools to the bill.

**CURRENT LAW:** G.S. 115C-84.2 provides that, with certain exceptions, the opening date for students in a school calendar must be no earlier than the Monday closest to August 26, and the closing date for students must be no later than the Friday closest to June 11.

**BILL ANALYSIS:** House Bill 12 would exempt Alamance-Burlington Schools and Guilford County Schools from the opening and closing date requirements of G.S. 115C-84.2, providing their respective school boards with flexibility to determine opening and closing dates for students through the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** The bill would be effective when it becomes law and would expire at the conclusion of the 2022-2023 school year.
