OVERVIEW: Section 9 of S.L. 2021-160 reduces the controlled hunting preserve operator license for rabbits from \$100 to \$25.

This section became effective September 20, 2021.

PRIOR LAW/BILL ANALYSIS:

The Wildlife Resources Commission is authorized to set standards for and license three types of controlled hunting preserves: one for domestically raised birds, one for foxes and coyotes, and one for rabbits. Under prior law, the fee for a controlled hunting preserve operator license for rabbits was \$100.

Section 9 of S.L. 2021-160 reduces the fee for a controlled hunting preserve operator license for rabbits from \$100 to \$25.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective September 20, 2021.
