

HOUSE BILL 181: Wildlife Resources Commission Amendments, Sec. 9A:

Unlawful Baiting Clarification

OVERVIEW: Section 9A of S.L. 2021-160 makes it unlawful for a person to place bait for the purpose of intentionally interfering with the lawful taking of wildlife. Violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor for a first offense, and a Class 1 misdemeanor for subsequent offenses.

This section became effective December 1, 2021, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.

CURRENT LAW/BILL ANALYSIS:

It is generally unlawful to use the aid of bait when taking wildlife. Section 11 of S.L.2019-204 made it unlawful to take turkey within 300 yards of an area that has been baited until 10 days after the bait has been removed.

Section 9A of S.L. 2021-160 makes it unlawful for a person to place bait for the purpose of intentionally interfering with the lawful taking of wildlife. Violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor for a first offense, and a Class 1 misdemeanor for subsequent offenses.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective December 1, 2021, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
