## **OVERVIEW:** House Bill 2 would adopt the bottlenose dolphin as the State marine mammal.

CURRENT LAW: Chapter 145 of the General Statutes adopts various State animals including:

- G.S. 145-2. State Bird (cardinal).
- G.S. 145-5. State mammal (gray squirrel; Sciurus carolinensis).
- G.S. 145-6. State saltwater fish (channel bass; red drum).
- G.S. 145-7. State insect (honeybee).
- G.S. 145-9. State reptile (turtle).
- G.S. 145-13. State dog (Plott Hound).
- G.S. 145-26. State freshwater trout (brook trout; Salvelinus fontinalis).
- G.S. 145-31. State horse (Colonial Spanish Mustang).
- G.S. 145-38. State butterfly (Eastern tiger swallowtail; Papilio glaucus).
- G.S. 145-42. State frog (pine barrens tree frog; Hyla andersonii).
- G.S. 145-43. State salamander (marbled salamander; Ambystoma opacum).
- G.S. 145-44. State marsupial (Virginia opossum; Didelphis virginiana).

**BILL ANALYSIS:** House Bill 2 would adopt the bottlenose dolphin as the State marine mammal.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** House Bill 2 would be effective when it becomes law.
