OVERVIEW: House Bill 336 would adopt the osprey as the official raptor of the State of North Carolina.

CURRENT LAW: State symbols and other official adoptions of the State are found in Chapter 145 of the General Statutes. Currently, North Carolina does not have an official State raptor.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 336 would adopt the osprey (*Pandion haliaetus carolinensis*) as the official raptor of the State of North Carolina.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective when it becomes law.
