OVERVIEW: House Bill 365 would authorize the Greater Asheville Regional Airport Authority to operate, own, lease, sublease, control, regulate, and/or grant to others the right to operate office buildings, industrial and manufacturing facilities, retail facilities, recreational facilities, entertainment venues and facilities, and technology and wireless infrastructure on airport premises.

CURRENT LAW: S.L. 2012-121 creates the Greater Asheville Regional Airport Authority, providing for its organization, membership, powers, and authorities. Subdivision (14) of Section 1.6(a) of S.L. 2012-121 allows the Greater Asheville Regional Airport Authority to operate, own, lease, sublease, control, regulate, and/or grant to others the right to operate various businesses, including mechanical services, parking, storage, restaurants, vending machines, and personal services on any airport premises.

The Greater Asheville Regional Airport Authority is not currently authorized to operate, own, lease, sublease, control, regulate, and/or grant to others the right to operate office buildings, industrial and manufacturing facilities, retail facilities, recreational facilities, entertainment venues and facilities, or technology and wireless infrastructure on any airport premises.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 365 would allow the Greater Asheville Regional Airport Authority to operate, own, lease, sublease, control, regulate, and/or grant to others the right to operate office buildings, industrial and manufacturing facilities, retail facilities, recreational facilities, entertainment venues and facilities, and technology and wireless infrastructure on any airport premises on any airport premises.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The act would be effective July 1, 2025.
