**OVERVIEW:** *House Bill 552 would authorize remote conversion of a provisional license to a regular drivers license specifically for a member of the Armed Forces, deployed out-of-state.*

## CURRENT LAW:

**G.S. 20-7(f)(6)** allows the Division of Motor Vehicles to offer remote renewal of a drivers license or remote conversion of a full provision license, and provides eligibility requirements.

**S.L. 2019-227** amended the law to allow individuals to comply with the address requirement by providing the address where the license holder resides at the time the remote renewal or conversion is requested, in the event that that address is different than the one on the license.

## BILL ANALYSIS:

### Section 1 would:

- Authorize remote conversion of a provisional license to a regular drivers license specifically for a member of the Armed Forces, deployed out-of-state.
- Direct the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to adopt rules to implement this provision.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This bill would become effective October 1, 2021, and apply to any application to remotely convert a provisional license submitted on or after that date.
