OVERVIEW: S.L. 2021-70 amends the conditions when a physician assistant or a nurse practitioner must consult with the supervising physician prior to prescribing a targeted controlled substance.

This act became effective October 1, 2021.

CURRENT LAW: Under G.S. 90-18.1 and G.S. 90-18.2, a physician assistant or a nurse practitioner is required to consult with the supervising physician prior to prescribing a targeted controlled substance when all of the following conditions apply:

- The patient is being treated by a facility that primarily engages in the treatment of pain by prescribing narcotic medications or advertises in any medium for any type of pain management services.
- The therapeutic use of the targeted controlled substance will or is expected to exceed a period of 30 days.

BILL ANALYSIS:

Sections 1.(a) and **1.(b)** remove the circumstance when a patient is being treated by a facility that advertises in any medium for any type of pain management services from the conditions that require a physician assistant or a nurse practitioner to consult with the supervising physician prior to prescribing a targeted controlled substance.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act became effective October 1, 2021.



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
