**OVERVIEW:** *The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) for House Bill 673 would direct the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety to study the collection, correlation, and maintenance of traffic stop data.*

**BILL ANALYSIS:** The PCS for House Bill 673 would direct the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety to study the reporting and collection of traffic stop data under G.S. 143B-903 and report to the 2022 Regular Session of the 2021 General Assembly.

The study shall include topics enumerated in the bill, including a comparative analysis of how other states collect, correlate, and maintain traffic stop data. The Committee will also be required to conduct an analysis as to the best methods for collecting, correlating, and maintaining traffic stop data.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act would be effective when it becomes law.
