OVERVIEW: House Bill 699 would increase the punishments for the abuse or neglect of a disabled or elder adult.

BILL ANALYSIS:

House Bill 699 would raise the punishment for abuse of a disabled or elder adult to a Class E felony (previously Class F) for serious injury and to a Class G felony (previously Class H) for injury.

It would raise the punishment for neglect of a disabled or elder adult to a Class F felony (previously Class G) for serious injury and to a Class H felony (previously Class I) for injury.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective December 1, 2021 and would apply to offenses committed on or after that date.
