OVERVIEW: House Bill 73 would require the ABC Commission to renew or register certain ABC permits that are active as of April 30, 2021 for the period of May 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022 without payment. The bill would also allow someone who has prepaid those fees to get a refund.

CURRENT LAW: Generally, ABC permits are valid after the payment of an annual renewal or registration fee for one year from the period of May 1 to April 30. (G.S. 18B-903)

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 73 would require the ABC Commission to renew or register without payment certain ABC permits that are active as of April 30, 2021 for the period of May 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022 and would also allow anyone who has already paid a fee for a listed permit to request a refund from the ABC Commission. House Bill 73 would apply to the following ABC permits:

- On-premises malt beverage permit
- On-premises unfortified wine permit
- On-premises fortified wine permit
- Mixed beverages permit
- Culinary permit
- Mixed beverages catering permit
- Guest room cabinet permit
- Wine tasting permit
- Wine shop permit
- Malt beverage tasting permit
- Spirituous liquor tasting permit
- Antique spirituous liquor permit
- Common area entertainment permit

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective when it becomes law.

BACKGROUND: The General Assembly recently ratified House Bill 4 which clarified that certain ABC permittees who were subject to an order of closure in the Governor's Executive Order 141 would not have to pay any permit fees until 90 days after the Governor signed an executive order rescinding limitations on those permittees' operation, could seek refunds for any fees already paid, and would retain active permits without payment of the fee.
