OVERVIEW: House Bill 768 would direct the Legislative Research Commission to study the alcoholic beverage control laws of North Carolina.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 768 would direct the Legislative Research Commission to study revising Chapter 18 B of the General Statutes governing the manufacturing, sale, possession, and consumption of alcoholic beverages in this State and report to the 2022 Regular Session of the 2021 General Assembly.

The study shall include the topics enumerated in the bill, including a comparative analysis of how federal law and other states regulate the labeling, distribution, manufacture, sale, possession, and consumption of alcoholic beverages; a comparative analysis of how other states define and regulate spirituous liquor, alcohol consumables, permits for manufacturing, and happy hours; and other specific issues.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective when it becomes law.
