## HOUSE BILL 911: Regulatory Reform Act of 2022, Sec. 9: Exempt Off-Frame Modular Homes from Certain Design Elements Required by the North Carolina Building Code

OVERVIEW: Section 9 of S.L. 2022-75 exempts certain modular home designs from certain requirements for roof pitch, eave projection, minimum heights, siding and roofing materials, and foundations found in in the North Carolina Building Code.

This section became effective July 12, 2022.

## **CURRENT LAW & BILL ANALYSIS:**

A modular home is statutorily defined as a factory-built structure that is designed to be used as a dwelling, is manufactured in accordance with State Residential Building Code specifications for modular homes, and bears a seal or label issued by the Department of Insurance pursuant to <u>G.S. 143-139.1</u>.

To qualify for a label or seal signifying manufacture in compliance with the State Building Code, a modular home intended for single-family use must comply with certain requirements for roof pitch, eave projection, minimum height of the first-story exterior wall, siding and roofing materials, and foundations, as set forth in G.S. 143-139.1(a).

**Section 9 of S.L. 2022-75** amends G.S. 143-139.1(a) by making it applicable only to single-family modular homes that are built on a frame. Modular homes that are not built on a frame would not have to meet the requirements set forth in this subsection to be certified as having been manufactured in compliance with the State Residential Building Code.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective July 12, 2022.
