

HOUSE BILL 911: Regulatory Reform Act of 2022, Sec. 10: Extend Deadline for Small Municipalities to 2021-2022 General Assembly **Adopt Comprehensive Land-Use Plans**

OVERVIEW: Section 10 of S.L. 2022-75 gives municipalities with a population of 1,500 or less an extra year to adopt a comprehensive land-use plan as required by the 2019 reorganization of State's land-use regulatory laws.

This section became effective July 12, 2022.

CURRENT LAW & BILL ANALYSIS:

S.L. 2019-111 made various changes to the land-use regulatory laws of the State, including reorganizing and consolidating existing statutes governing local government regulation of land planning and development into a new Chapter 160D. Section 2.9(c) of S.L. 2019-111 provided that any local government that has adopted zoning regulations but had not yet adopted a comprehensive plan must adopt such a plan no later than July 1, 2022.

Section 10 of S.L. 2022-75 extends the deadline to adopt a comprehensive plan to July 1, 2023 for municipalities with a population of 1,500 or less.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective July 12, 2022.
