OVERVIEW: House Bill 96 would allow pharmacists to administer injectable drugs.

CURRENT LAW: Under current law, immunizing pharmacists may administer the vaccines listed in G.S. 90-85.15B.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 96 would allow immunizing pharmacists to administer injectable drugs to adults. The Board of Pharmacy and Medical Board would be required to adopt the rules necessary to administer this act, including creating written protocols pharmacists must follow when administering the dugs and developing record keeping requirements. The rules must be adopted no later than April 1, 2022.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The provisions allowing pharmacists to administer drugs would be effective July1, 2022. The remainder of the bill would be effective when it becomes law.
