

## **SENATE BILL 128: Bd. of Trustees/Isothermal CC.**

**OVERVIEW:** Senate Bill 128 would do the following:

- Allow up to two members of the boards of county commissioners in Rutherford and Polk counties to be members of the Board of Trustees of Isothermal Community College.
- Require the members of the Board of Trustees of Isothermal Community College to maintain their county of residence while serving on the board.

**CURRENT LAW:** G.S. 115D-12 requires each community college to have a board of trustees and sets the requirements for the selection of the trustees. Isothermal Community College has a local modification to that statute in S.L. 2015-243.

The Board of Trustees of Isothermal Community College is made up of 15 members, as follows:

- 7 trustees elected by the Rutherford County Commissioners.
- 3 trustees elected by the Polk County Commissioners.
- 4 trustees appointed by the Governor.
- The president of the student government or the chair of the executive board of the student body.

No more than one trustee elected by a board of county commissioners can be a county commissioner. Each trustee, other than the student trustee, must be a resident of Isothermal Community College's administrative area or a contiguous county.

**BILL ANALYSIS:** <u>Section 1</u> would allow up to two members of the boards of county commissioners to be members of the Board of Trustees, as follows:

- Up to one trustee elected by the Rutherford County Commissioners can be a Rutherford County Commissioner.
- Up to one trustee elected by the Polk County Commissioners can be a Polk County Commissioner.

<u>Section 2</u> would require that each trustee on the Board of Trustees of Isothermal Community College remain a resident of the same county where the trustee resided at the time of the trustee's appointment throughout the term of office on the board.

Section 3 would make this act apply only to Isothermal Community College.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This act would be effective when it becomes law and would apply to appointments to terms beginning on or after July 1, 2021.
