OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 148 would extend the validity of certain improvement permits or authorizations for wastewater system construction from January 1, 2020, to January 1, 2024.

CURRENT LAW AND BACKGROUND:

G.S. 130A-336 generally requires that any proposed site for a residence, place of business, or place of public assembly in an area not served by an approved wastewater system must obtain both an improvement permit and an authorization for wastewater system construction from the appropriate local health department before beginning construction.

G.S. 130A-336(b1), enacted by S.L. 2017-211, provides that an improvement permit or authorization for wastewater system construction issued by a local health department between January 1, 2000, and January 1, 2015, which had not been acted on and would have otherwise expired, remains valid until January 1, 2020.

BILL ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 148 would extend the validity of improvement permits or authorizations for wastewater system construction previously extended under G.S. 130A-336(b1) from January 1, 2020, to January 1, 2024.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective when it becomes law.
