OVERVIEW: The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) for Senate Bill 374 would authorize the use of blue lights on the rear of publicly owned automotive fire apparatus vehicles.

[As introduced, this bill was identical to H448, as introduced by Reps. Potts, Boles, Moss, which is currently in House Judiciary 2.]

CURRENT LAW: G.S. 20-130.1 prohibits the use of red and blue lights on any vehicle other than those excepted by the statute.

BILL ANALYSIS:

Senate Bill 374 would authorize the installation, activation, and operation of blue lights on an automotive fire apparatus vehicle as defined in the most recent version of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1901: Standard for Automotive Fire Apparatus if the automotive fire apparatus is publicly owned, the blue lights are only visible from the rear of the vehicle when the parking brake is engaged, and the vehicle's on-scene lights are engaged.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act becomes effective December 1, 2021.
