**OVERVIEW:** Senate Bill 375 would modify the supervision requirements for certified alcohol and drug counselors as well as those for certified criminal justice addictions professionals.

**CURRENT LAW:** Currently, certified criminal justice addictions professionals and certified alcohol and drug counselors must be supervised at a ratio of 1 hour of supervision for every 40 hours of practice.

**BILL ANALYSIS:** Senate Bill 375 would eliminate the supervision requirement for certified criminal justice addictions professionals. Certified alcohol and drug counselors would have to be supervised at a ratio of 1 hour of supervision for every 40 hours of practice for their first two years of practice. After two years, the ratio would be reduced to 1 hour of supervision for every 80 hours of practice. After four years, the ratio would be reduced to 1 hour of supervision for every 160 hours of practice.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This bill would be effective October 1, 2021.
