OVERVIEW: Section 5 of S.L. 2021-158 shortens the deadline to request a civil penalty remission under the Sedimentation and Erosion Control Program from 60 to 30 days.

This section became effective October 1, 2021 and applies to penalties assessed on or after that date.

PRIOR LAW/BILL ANALYSIS:

Prior to the enactment of S.L. 2021-158, the Sedimentation Pollution Control Act provided that a person assessed a civil penalty has 60 days from the receipt of notice of the assessment to request a remission of that civil penalty.

Section 5 of S.L. 2021-158 shortens the deadline to request a civil penalty remission from 60 to 30 days.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section became effective October 1, 2021 and applies to penalties assessed on or after that date.
