reflects the contents of the bill as it was presented in committee.

OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 69 would amend graduated drivers licensing requirements by temporarily reducing the amount of time an applicant must hold a Level 1 limited learner's permit before applying for a Level 2 limited provisional license. The modification to requirements would expire on December 31, 2021.

CURRENT LAW: Under the graduated driver's license statute (G.S. 20-11), there are three levels of driving privileges for persons less than 18 years old: Level 1 - limited learner's permit; Level 2 - limited provisional license; and Level 3 - full provisional license. (See the chart on page 2 for detailed requirements and restrictions for each level.) A teen must hold a Level 1 permit for at least 12 months, among other requirements, before being eligible to apply for a Level 2 license.
BILL ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 69 would amend graduated drivers licensing requirements and restrictions by reducing the amount of time a person is required to hold a Level 1 limited learner's permit before being eligible to apply for a Level 2 limited provisional license from 12 months to 9 months. However, an applicant would still have to be at least 16 years old before applying for a Level 2 and would have to meet all other current requirements, including logging 60 hours of driving experience.
EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would be effective when it becomes law, but the modification would be temporary, applying to any person applying for a Level 2 limited provisional license on or after the effective date of the act and expiring on December 31, 2021.
