OVERVIEW: *The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) for House Bill 194 would authorize the North Carolina State Bar (State Bar) to charge and collect administrative fees for both of the following:*

- *Noncompliance suspension*
- *Participation in a diversion program.*

BILL ANALYSIS:

The PCS for House Bill 194 would authorize the State Bar to charge and collect administrative fees in both the following instances:

- When an attorney is issued a noncompliance suspension. A noncompliance suspension may be issued when an attorney has failed to respond to a notice or request from the Grievance Committee.
- When an attorney participates in a diversion program offered by the Grievance Committee.

The amount of the administrative fee would be determined by the State Bar.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective October 1, 2023.
