

HOUSE BILL 259: 2023 Appropriations Act, Sec. 41.14D: Increase Electric and Hybrid Vehicle Fees

OVERVIEW: Section 41.14D of S.L. 2023-134 increases the additional registration fee for electric vehicles and creates a new additional registration fee for plug-in hybrid vehicles.

This section becomes effective January 1, 2024, and applies to vehicles registered on or after that date.

CURRENT LAW: The Division of Motor Vehicles charges an additional annual fee of \$140.25 to register certain electric vehicles. This fee is in addition to the standard registration and licensing fees for passenger vehicles. Every four years, this fee, along with a number of other DMV fees, are adjusted for inflation in accordance with the Consumer Price Index computed by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

BILL ANALYSIS: This section increases the annual additional fee from \$140.25 to \$180.00 for plug-in vehicles that are not low-speed vehicles and that do not rely on a nonelectric source of power. It also establishes a new additional annual fee of \$90.00 for plug-in hybrid vehicles. Both of these fees are subject to the quadrennial inflation adjustment.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This section becomes effective January 1, 2024, and applies to vehicles registered on or after that date.
