# HOUSE BILL 600: Regulatory Reform Act of 2023, Sec. 50: Delete Conflicting Water/Sewer Provision in Session Law 2023-108

**OVERVIEW:** Section 50 of S.L. 2023-108 makes a technical change to S.L. 2023-108 to delete language regarding forced water/sewer connections that conflicts with S.L. 2023-90.

*This bill was vetoed by the Governor on October 2, 2023, and that veto was overridden by the General Assembly on October 10, 2023. This section became effective on October 10, 2023.*

## **BILL ANALYSIS:**

Section 10 of Session Law 2023-90 and Section 12 of Session Law 2023-108 both amend the same statute, G.S. 160A-317, and both limit the ability of municipalities to force water/sewer connection. The language in S.L. 2023-108 is an earlier version of the language in S.L. 2023-90 and conflicts with the already enacted language in S.L. 2023-90.

**Section 50** deletes the conflicting language in S.L. 2023-108.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This bill was vetoed by the Governor on October 2, 2023, and that veto was overridden by the General Assembly on October 10, 2023. This section became effective on October 10, 2023.
