OVERVIEW: Senate Bill 246 would modify the law of first degree trespass to include entering or remaining on the premises of another between the hours of midnight and 6:00 A.M.

CURRENT LAW: G.S. 14-159.12, first degree trespass, prohibits a person from entering or remaining in the following areas:

- The premises of another that is enclosed or secured.
- A building of another.
- On the lands of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians after the person has been excluded.

First degree trespass is generally punished as a Class 2 misdemeanor, but certain listed aggravating factors may increase the punishment level.

BILL ANALYSIS: Senate Bill 246 would modify G.S. 14-159.12 by making entering or remaining in the following area a violation of first degree trespass:

• The premises of another between the hours of midnight and 6:00 A.M.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to offenses committed on or after that date.
