

SENATE BILL 265: Increase Municipal Election Participation Act.

OVERVIEW: The bill would do the following:

- > Change the time of elections for the municipalities of Flat Rock, Fletcher, Hendersonville, Laurel Park, Mills River, Columbus, Saluda, Tryon, Bostic, Chimney Rock, Ellenboro, Forest City, Lake Lure, Ruth, Rutherfordton, and Spindale (all municipalities in Henderson, Polk, and Rutherford Counties) to even-years, beginning in 2024.
- > Extend the term of office for the Mayor of the Town of Tryon from two years to four years, beginning in 2024.
- > Extend the term of office for the Mayor and Commissioners for the Town of Ruth from two years to four years, beginning in 2024.

CURRENT LAW: The following chart summarizes the current town officers, terms of office, and method of election in the Village of Flat Rock, Town of Fletcher, City of Hendersonville, Town of Laurel Park, Town of Mills River, Town of Columbus, City of Saluda, Town of Tryon, Town of Bostic, Chimney Rock Village, Town of Ellenboro, Town of Forest City, Town of Lake Lure, Town of Ruth, Town of Rutherfordton, and Town of Spindale.

BILL ANALYSIS: The bill would do the following:

- ➤ Provide that municipal elections in the municipalities listed above would be conducted in the evennumbered years, beginning with the 2024 elections. To implement this change, there would be no municipal election in the municipalities listed above in 2023, and the current terms of officers would be increased by one year. Regular municipal elections would resume in 2024 at the same time as the general election.
- For the Town of Tryon, extend the terms of office for the Mayor from two years to four years, beginning in 2024.
- For the Town of Ruth, extend the term of office for the Mayor and Commissioners for the Town of Ruth from two years to four years, beginning in 2024.

EFFECTIVE DATE: Effective when it becomes law and applies to elections held on or after that date.

BACKGROUND: G.S. 163-279 establishes a statewide default rule for the timing of municipal elections as odd-numbered years.
