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OVERVIEW: *House Bill 1067 would prohibit the City of Rocky Mount from exercising extraterritorial jurisdiction over certain described properties.*

CURRENT LAW: Except under certain circumstances, a city may regulate land use within an area beyond its corporate limits, commonly referred to as extraterritorial jurisdiction. Land use regulations include zoning, subdivision regulation, building code enforcement, minimum housing code enforcement, historic preservation, erosion and sedimentation control, and historic district regulation.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 1067 would do the following:

- Eliminate the Town of Rocky Mount's authority to exercise extraterritorial jurisdiction over three identified parcels.
- Return those parcels to the jurisdiction of Nash County.

EFFECTIVE DATE: House Bill 1067 would be effective when it becomes law.
