

HOUSE BILL 113: Create Committee on Medicaid Sustainability.

OVERVIEW: House Bill 113 would establish a Joint Legislative Committee on Medicaid Sustainability (Committee) to consider ways in which the current North Carolina Medicaid program could be modified to respond to any decreases in federal financial support for the program and maintain current State funding levels. A final report of the Committee would be due to the General Assembly by April 30, 2026.

BILL ANALYSIS: Section 1 would establish a Joint Legislative Committee on Medicaid Sustainability (Committee). Under **Section 2**, the Committee would consist of six senators appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and six representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Under **Section 3**, the purpose of the Committee would be to consider ways in which the current North Carolina Medicaid program could be modified to respond to any decreases in federal financial support for the program and maintain current State funding levels. The modifications could include reducing or eliminating services or eligibility groups, adding provider assessments, reducing provider reimbursement rates, achieving managed care efficiencies, or saving costs through other opportunities.

Sections 4, 5, and 6 would establish standard authority for meeting procedures, staffing, and reimbursement related to the Committee.

Section 7 would require the Committee to submit a final report to the General Assembly on the results of its work by April 30, 2026. The Committee would expire on that date or when the report is filed, whichever is earlier.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective when it becomes law.
