OVERVIEW: House Bill 120 would appropriate \$1,040,514 to the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), Division of Aging to expand the Project Caregiver Alternatives to Running on Empty (Project CARE).

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 120 would appropriate \$1,404,514 in recurring funds for the 2025-26 and 2026-27 fiscal years from the General Fund to DHHS, Division of Aging to expand Project CARE.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act is effective when it becomes law.

BACKGROUND: Project CARE prioritizes the needs, values and preferences of individuals who directly care for a family member or friend with Alzheimer's disease or related dementia by providing care consultation, dementia-specific information, caregiver education, funds for self-directed respite care (when available), connections to community-based services and resources, and referrals to the Family Caregiver Support Program and Area Agencies on Aging.
