## **OVERVIEW:** House Bill 213 would require employers to post a printed notice, furnished by the Department of Labor, providing information about benefits and services available to veterans under State law.

**BILL ANALYSIS:** House Bill 213 would require employers to post a notice, in a conspicuous place in every room where five or more persons are employed, stating the provisions of law relating to veterans' benefits in this State.

At a minimum, the notice would include the following information:

- The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs' (DMVA) contact and website information for veterans' services.
- Benefits and claims.
- Employment and training.
- Housing assistance, including assistance for homeless veterans.
- Requests for military records.

The bill would require the Department of Labor (DOL) to consult with the DMVA to create and distribute the veterans' benefits and services poster, and would require the notice to be made available by the Commissioner of Labor either in digital form on the DOL website or in printed form upon request.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would become effective when it becomes law.
