OVERVIEW: House Bill 614 would require the performance of an autopsy in any case related to a fire incident in which human remains are found.

CURRENT LAW:

G.S. 130A-389 requires an autopsy to be performed in the following instances:

- The medical examiner determines it's in the public interest.
- It is requested by the district attorney of the county or any superior court judge.
- The district attorney asserts there is probable cause to believe that a violation of G.S. 14-18.4 (Death by distribution of a controlled substance) has occurred.
- At the request of the deceased's next-of-kin or health care power of attorney.

BILL ANALYSIS:

House Bill 614 would require an autopsy be performed in any case related to a fire incident in which human remains are found.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would become effective October 1, 2025, and apply to cases arising on or after that date.
