OVERVIEW: House Bill 859 would prohibit counties and cities from adopting or enforcing guaranteed income programs that are not expressly authorized by general or local law.

BILL ANALYSIS: Section 1 of House Bill 859 would amend Chapter 153A (Counties) of the General Statutes to provide that unless expressly authorized by general or local law, a county shall not adopt or enforce any ordinance, resolution, or policy that has the purpose or effect of making an unconditional cash payment on a regular basis to an individual under a guaranteed income program. This prohibition would not apply to a program under which an individual is required to seek reemployment, perform work, or attend training as a condition of receiving a cash payment.

Section 2 of the bill would amend Chapter 160A (Cities) of the General Statutes to apply the same prohibition to cities.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This act would be effective when it becomes law.
