OVERVIEW: House Bill 97 would expand eligibility under the Public Safety Employees' Death Benefits Act (the Act) by covering firefighters who are killed by stomach cancer.

CURRENT LAW:

G.S. 143-166.2(6) currently defines a firefighter to be killed in the line of duty when their death is caused by any of six types of listed cancers.

BILL ANALYSIS:

House Bill 97 would add stomach cancer to the list of cancers that is found in the definition of "Killed in the line of duty" in G.S. 143-166.2(6). This means a firefighter would be eligible for benefits under the Act if their death was the result of stomach cancer.

EFFECTIVE DATE:

This act would be effective July 1, 2025, and would apply to qualifying deaths occurring on or after that date.
