MEMORANDUM

To: House of Representatives

Re: Amendment to HB 1114 (June Tech. Corrections)
Date: June 8, 2026

General Comments

This amendment consists of technical corrections recently approved by the General Statutes Commission at its June 5, 2026, meeting.

Specific Comments

This amendment adds Sections 83.1, 83.2, 85.1, and 87.1 to the bill:

Section 83.1(a) amends G.S. 90-85.3 as follows:

- Throughout the section, modernizes the format of definitions.
- In subdivision (1), adds an Oxford comma.
- In subdivision (4), adds clarifying language.
- In subdivision (5), replaces legalese with plain English, fixes punctuation, adds clarifying language, and deletes unnecessary language.
- In subdivision (7), adds an Oxford comma.
- In subdivision (8), adds an Oxford comma, fixes other punctuation, makes conforming formatting changes, and replaces legalese with plain English.
- In subdivision (9), deletes redundant terms and rewords for greater clarity.
- In subdivision (10), adds clarifying language, makes conforming formatting changes, adds an Oxford comma, and fixes the format of a citation.
- In subdivision (11), deletes unnecessary language.
- In subdivision (12), makes stylistic changes and adds clarifying language.
- In subdivision (13), makes conforming formatting changes and corrects a cross-reference.
- In subdivision (14), adds an Oxford comma, replaces legalese with plain English, and makes a stylistic change.
- In subdivision (15), adds an Oxford comma.
- In subdivision (17), makes conforming formatting changes, deletes redundant use of a term, fixes the format of a citation, and replaces legalese with plain English.
- In subdivision (18), makes conforming formatting changes.
- In subdivision (28), replaces legalese with plain English and deletes redundant use of a term.

Section 83.1(b) amends G.S. 58-56A-1 as follows:

- In subdivisions (1) and (2), makes stylistic changes.
- In subdivisions (5), (5a), and (7), deletes unnecessary language.
- In subdivision (13), corrects a cross-reference.
- In subdivision (14), fixes a relative pronoun.

- In subdivision (16a) and (17), deletes unnecessary language.

Section 83.1(c) amends G.S. 90-85.44 as follows:

- In subsection (a), deletes unnecessary language, corrects a cross-reference, and fixes an internal citation.
- In subsection (b), adds clarifying language.
- In subsection (c), fixes subject-verb agreement.
- In subsection (h), adds clarifying language, makes a stylistic change, and fixes subject-verb agreement.

Section 83.1(d) amends G.S. 106-140.1 as follows:

- In subsection (a), rewrites the subsection for greater clarity and combines with it the substance of subsections (b) and (i).
- Strikes subsection (b) and adds it to subsection (a).
- In subsection (c), makes a conforming change to an internal citation, makes language gender neutral, fixes the format of a citation, and updates a term to better conform with State and federal law.
- In subsection (d), makes stylistic changes.
- In subsection (e), rewords for greater clarity.
- In subsection (f), corrects a cross-reference, deletes unnecessary language, and adds clarifying language.
- In subsection (g), deletes unnecessary language and replaces legalese with plain English.
- In subsection (h), deletes unnecessary language, rewords for greater clarity, and fixes the format of a citation.
- Strikes subsection (i) and adds it to subsection (a).
- In subsection (j), adds clarifying language, modernizes the format of definitions, fixes relative pronouns, deletes unnecessary language, fixes the format of a citation, updates a definition to conform with federal law, updates a term to better conform with State and federal law, and replaces legalese with plain English.

Section 83.2 amends G.S. 95-4 as follows:

- Shortens the section catch line.
- In the introductory paragraph, replaces legalese with plain English, deletes unnecessary language, fixes a reference, and modernizes the format of a list.
- In subdivision (1), deletes unnecessary or obsolete language and fixes a grammatical error. Much of this language is made obsolete by Chapter 126 (North Carolina Human Resources Act) of the General Statutes.
- In subdivision (2), replaces legalese with plain English and deletes unnecessary or obsolete language.
- In subdivision (4), shortens language, moves language from subdivision (6) of this section, deletes unnecessary language, and makes language gender-neutral.
- In subdivision (5), makes language gender-neutral, updates obsolete language, and deletes duplicative language.
- In subdivision (6), updates obsolete language, replaces legalese with plain English, and deletes duplicative language.
- In subdivision (7), deletes unnecessary language.

Section 85.1(a) amends G.S. 105-278.6A as follows:

- In subsection (b), shortens language and makes a conforming change to the repeal of Article 64 of Chapter 58 of the General Statutes and the enactment of its successor article, Article 64A of Chapter 58 of the General Statutes by S.L. 2025-58. These articles discuss the regulation of continuing care retirement communities.
- In subsection (c), fixes punctuation.

Section 85.1(b) provides that the conforming change has a December 1, 2025, effective date, which mirrors the effective date of S.L. 2025-58. The remainder of the section is effective when it becomes law.

Section 87.1(a) amends G.S. 143-52.1(e) to delete unnecessary language and to fix a reference to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

Section 87.1(b) amends G.S. 143-64.17G to fix a reference to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

Section 87.1(c) amends G.S. 143-128.3 to fix references to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations and to delete unnecessary language.

Section 87.1(d) amends G.S. 143-129(i) to delete unnecessary language and to fix a reference to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

Section 87.1(e) amends G.S. 143B-10(b) to make language gender-neutral, to replace legalese with plain English, to delete unnecessary or duplicative language, and to fix capitalization.

Section 87.1(f) amends G.S. 143B-12(b) to make language gender-neutral and to fix a reference to the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.
